Getting to ARF 2015

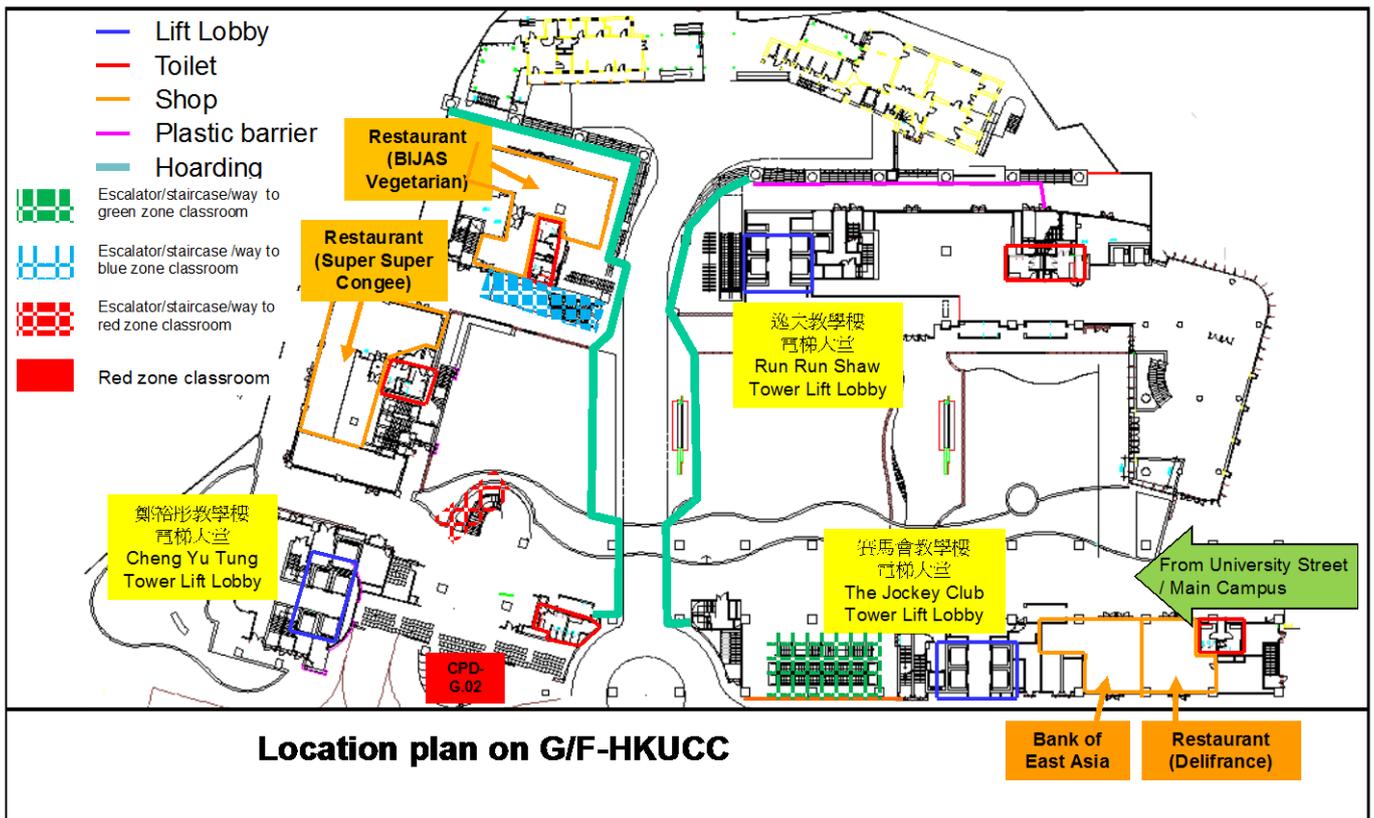
The main meeting room for the ARF is CPD 2.16, with other rooms for parallel sessions nearby. Registration will take place outside CPD2.16. This area is highlighted in blue on the map of the 2/F below.

This is located on the second floor of the Centennial Campus at HKU. To get here, you can take the MTR and exit at C1 (“Pokfulam Road”). Then take the lift or elevator up to the Footbridge and walk across to the centennial campus. Once there, take the lift up to the ground floor. Exit the lift, walk past the Visitor’s centre and Bijas restaurant and take the escalator on the right up to the 1/F. Turn around and take the escalator up to the 2/F and find your way in to CPD2.16.

Note: there is no elevator access to the 2/F – you will need to come up the escalator. If you are coming from within the centennial campus, find your way to the Ground Floor and follow instructions as above. Please see maps below for information on the Ground floors and Second floors.
